What is CCAP?



CCAP is a "last-in" scholarship. This means that CCAP funds are awarded if there is a balance due after federal, state grants and/or Educational Foundation scholarships are applied to tuition charges for up to 15 credits per semester.





Since 2008, \$10.5 million in CCAP awards have been provided to 4,221 students at Virginia Western.

The Value of CCAP



2 years, fall & spring – 60 credits +1 summer – 6 credits* or One AA, AS or AAS degree completion* or Two Certificates or Career Studies Certificates*

(*Whichever comes first within the two years of CCAP eligibility)



There are 3 different categories of high school seniors who may apply for CCAP.



Graduating seniors in Botetourt County, Craig County, Franklin County, City of Roanoke, Roanoke County and City of Salem who reside in and attend public high school in their locality junior and senior years.



Roanoke County residents graduating from any high school in the six localities served by Virginia Western may apply for CCAP.



Homeschooled and private school students who reside in Botetourt County, Craig County, Franklin County, Roanoke County and City of Salem for their junior and senior years.

Who is Awarded CCAP?



Do all who apply for CCAP get awarded?

No, CCAP award is not guaranteed. For 2024, qualified CCAP applicants will be awarded where sufficient funding is available for their locality.





CCAP funds pay tuition only.

CCAP does not pay for:

- Cost of textbooks
- IncludED textbook fees
- Additional course fees

- Supplies
- Living expenses
