HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT PARKING PASS APPLICATION

Va. Code § 22.1-205.1: Each public high school shall require any student who applies to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property to provide evidence that the student possesses a valid driver's license or driver privilege card. The Department of Education shall develop, and each public high school shall utilize, a standard application form for students to use to obtain a pass to park a vehicle on school property.

Teen Driving Restrictions

Virginia's driving restrictions are not meant to penalize teen drivers, but to help them stay safe while they gain valuable driving experience. Studies have found that these restrictions work to reduce the number of car crashes among young drivers.

Curfew Restrictions

If you are under age 18, Virginia law prohibits you from driving between midnight and 4 A.M. except when driving:

- to or from a place of business where you are employed
- to or from an activity that is supervised by an adult and is sponsored by a school or by a civic, religious, or public organization;
- with a licensed spouse age 18 or older, parent or other adult acting in loco parentis who is occupying the front passenger seat,
- in case of an emergency, including responding to emergency calls as a volunteer firefighter or rescue squad personnel

Restrictions on the Number of Passengers

If you are under age 18, you may carry only one passenger under age 21, unless accompanied by a licensed parent, or other adult acting in place of a parent, in the front passenger seat. However, after you have held your license for one year, you may carry up to three passengers under age 21 in the following situations:

- Travel to and from a school-sponsored activity;
- A licensed driver 21 or older is in the front passenger seat; or
- In case of an emergency

Learners permit holders may not carry more than one passenger under age 18
(Passenger restrictions do not apply to family members)

Cellular Telephone Restrictions

§ 46.2-818.2. Virginia's cellular telephone law prohibits any person from holding a handheld personal communications device while driving a moving motor vehicle on the highways in the Commonwealth

BCPS Student Driving Regulations

1. Students are expected to operate their vehicle in a safe manner at all times while on school property. Spinning tires, passing improperly, speeding (**Speed Limit 5 mph**) or any other violation will result in loss of driving privileges and could result in a traffic summons being issued.
2. Parking decals must be displayed and visible at all times while on school property.
3. Students must park in the assigned parking space. Vehicles are to be parked immediately upon entering school grounds. Students are not permitted to loiter in the parking lot or to sit in parked vehicles at any time during the school day. Student drivers who violate this regulation may be subject to loss of parking privileges at the discretion of the principal.
4. Driving and parking at school is a privilege. This privilege may be revoked for students not in good standing and a refund will not be issued. **Student drivers who are consistently tardy will be subject to loss of parking privileges at the discretion of the principal.**
5. Report any permanent or temporary changes in the information on the Parking Permit Application form immediately to the office (e.g. change of vehicle, change in license plate, etc.)
6. **Students are not permitted to transport anyone between BTEC/VWCC/MGCC/Regional Academy/Governors School and their home school. Students are not permitted to transport other students during the school day.**
7. Student vehicles are subject to search by school administration while parking on school grounds: Please see BCPS Policy JFG: Search and Seizure for more information.
